 - positions determined by current ex-comm members (with strong recommendations from respective committees)
- Things we do
 - lines of services: youth, international, disaster, blood, health and safety, outreach
 - specific goals within each line of service (i.e. youth: teaching first aid safety to elementary school students, promoting Red Cross in schools, etc.)
- Supervisors we keep in contact with for each line of service
- Financial segment: from the Student Government
 - fill out detailed budget request forms once a year
 - w/ all our programs, descriptions, and how much money will go to each one
- General and Committee Meetings

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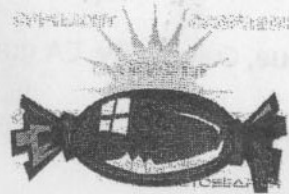
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Wrap Up...
